



Teaser Bets Might Be the Most Exciting Bet in Football.

So why does nobody bet them right?

Teasers are an exciting and potentially profitable way to bet on National Football League (NFL) games. A teaser bet lets you combine two or more NFL games into a single wager, and shifts the point spread for each team in your favor by a set number of points — typically +6. The catch? Every single team in your teaser has to win (with the +6 points) to win the bet.

For example, if you combine four teams into a teaser, and if all four cover their adjusted spread, a \$100 bet brings you \$300 in profit. That's real money. And because each team gets an extra **+6 points**, each leg is a lot more likely to actually come through — somewhere around **68% to 75% of the time** — compared to roughly 50% for a straight parlay. **A Teaser bet offers a bigger payout than a straight bet, and better odds than a parlay.** What's not to like?

Here's the twist: most touts don't appreciate teasers. One well-known betting site flat-out calls them “a sucker bet with an enormous house edge.” Others admit the math can work in your favor in limited circumstances, but they get cold feet fast: “keeping teasers simple is often the most effective approach... 2-team teasers strike the right balance between improved lines and manageable risk.” Translation: they stop at 2-teams and call it a day — without ever running the numbers on whether combining more teams into a multi-team bet might actually be smarter.

That's where Fred's Teaser Edge comes in.

I discarded conventional wisdom, dug into the actual numbers of NFL games over the past 21 years, and came to some surprising results: Give any team an extra +6 points, and it wins about **68-69%** of the time on average. Sounds great — until you realize sportsbooks price their payouts so that your teams need to win **71-73%** of the time just to break even. That gap is how the books make their money.

But I found certain situations that allowed teams to win (+6) at **75% or better!** Fred's Teaser Edge approach goes beyond the typical Wong teaser approach — it's a deeper look that most touts do not explore.
